- ➔ Battle of Pävankhind was a story of last stand that took place on **13 July 1660**, at a mountain pass in the vicinity of fort Vishalgad, near the city of Kolhapur with the Maratha warrior Baji Prabhu-Deshpande and Sambhu Singh Jadhav against Siddi Masud of the Bijapur Sultanate.

# FORT PANHALA !!!

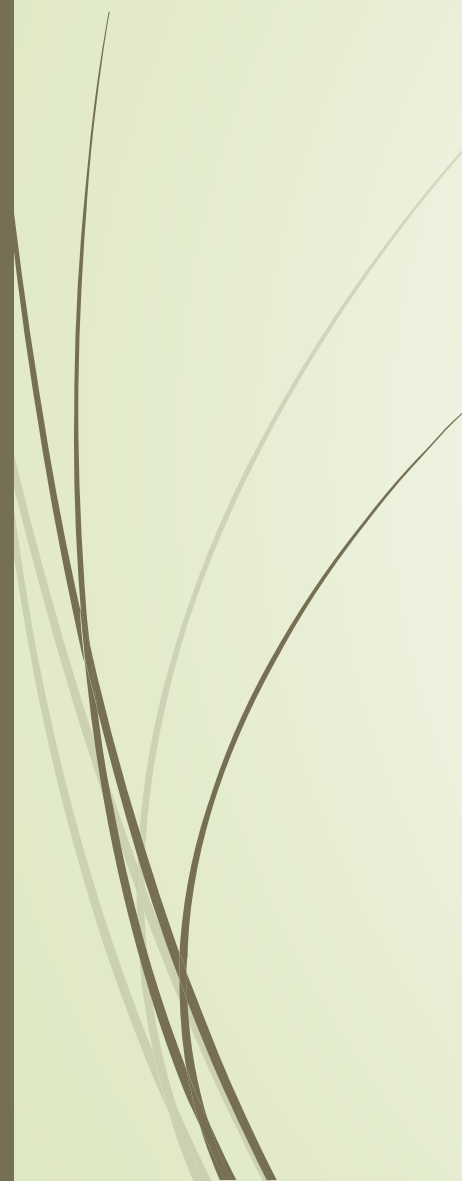
- From Kolhapur, Panhala Fort is just 20km away.
- Fort can be seen by own vehicle as the proper road is available to reach every point.
- Panhala Fort was built by King Bhoj 2 from shilahar dynasty in 1178 to 1209 CE. Fort came under Adil Shahi dynasty of Bijapur in 1489.
- Shivaji Maharaj took Panhala after the death of Afzal Khan in 1659.
- In 1660, Siddi Jauhar lays Siege to Panhala and we know know about Battle of Pawankhind.
- Andhar Bavadi, Teen Darwaja, Ambarkhana, Ganga Kothi (Storage building) and temple dedicated to lord Mahadev. Then Sajja Kothi, Ambabai temple.
- From Panhala you can left for **Amba Ghat** – a way to **Pavankhind and Marleshwar**.
- Many staying facilities in Amba Ghat

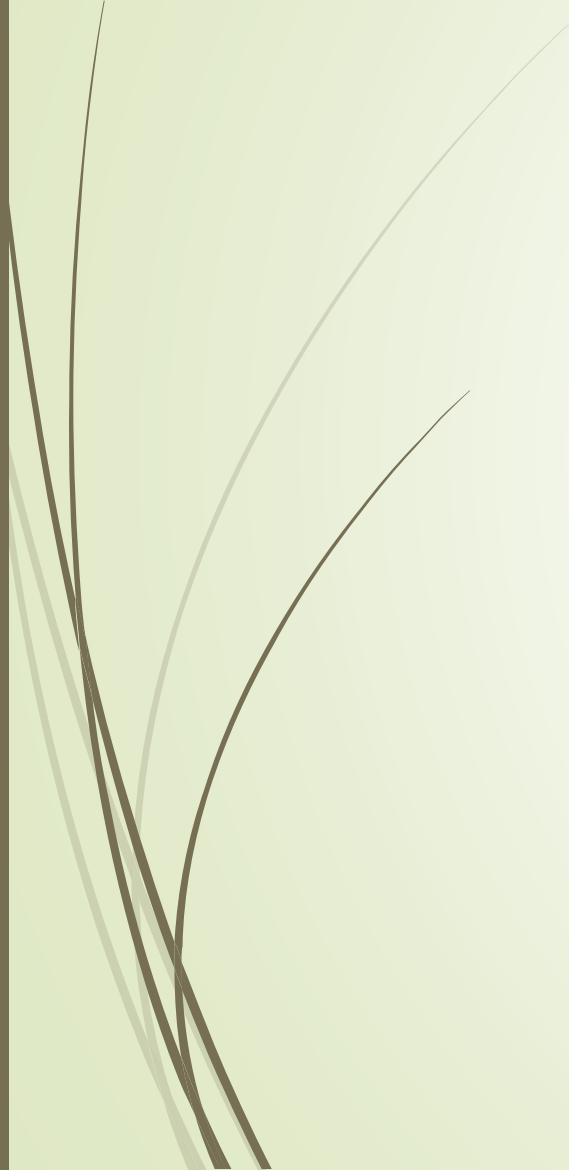

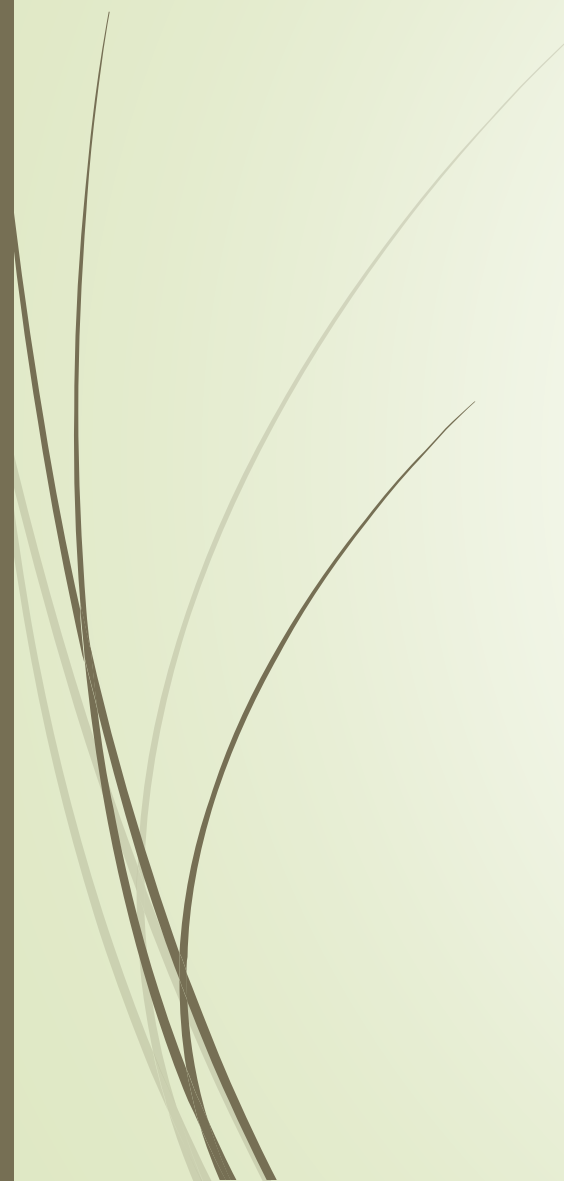

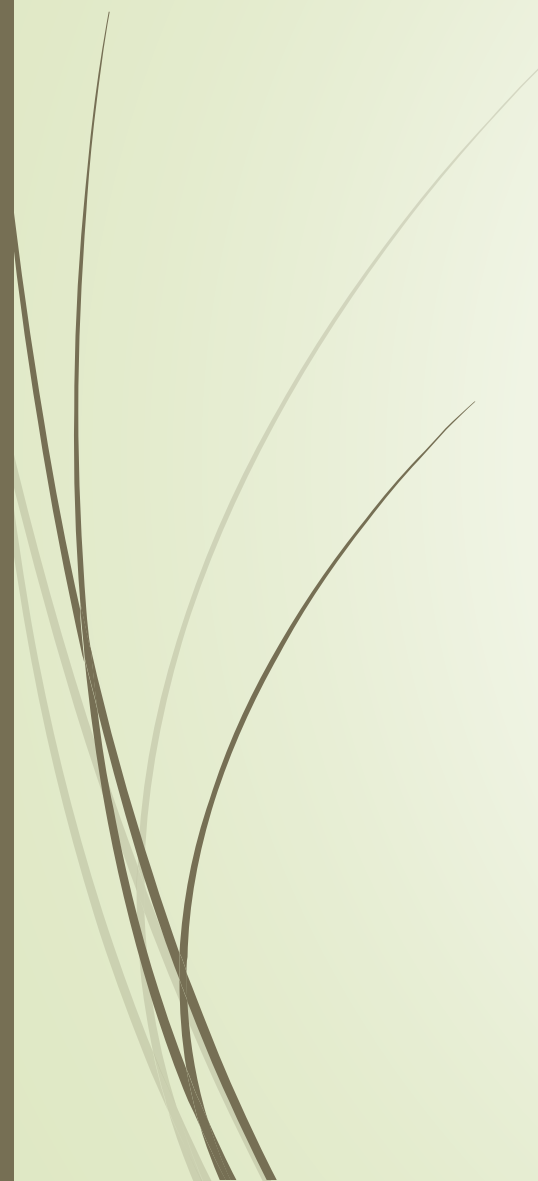












# PAVANKHIND





The main entrance to Pavankhindi looks like the ramparts of a fort. In the middle of the road is a circular stone construction.

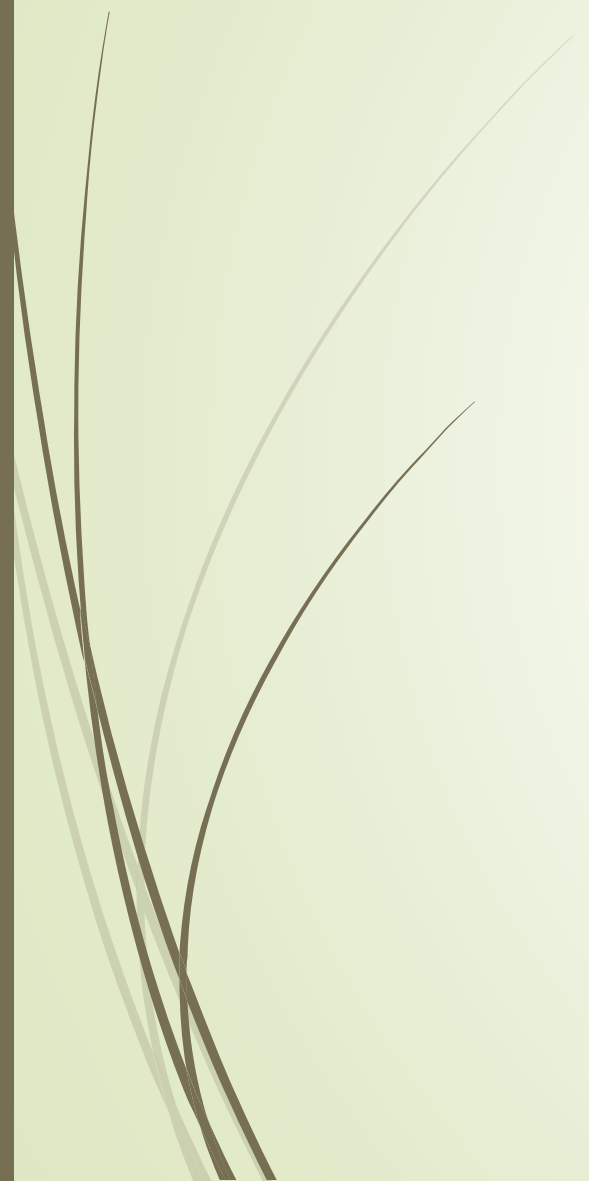
